## HOME EQUITY EARLY DISCLOSURE <br> IMPORTANT TERMS OF OUR HOME EQUITY LINE OF CREDIT PLAN

This disclosure contains important information about our Home Equity Line of Credit Plans. You should read it carefully and keep a copy for your records.

AVAILABILITY OF TERMS: All of the terms described below are subject to change. If these terms change (other than the annual percentage rate) and you decide, as a result, not to enter into an agreement with us, you are entitled to a refund of any fees that you pay to us or anyone else in connection with your application.

SECURITY INTEREST: We will take a security interest in your home. You could lose your home if you do not meet the obligations in your agreement with us.

POSSIBLE ACTIONS: We can terminate your line, require you to pay us the entire outstanding balance in one payment, and charge you certain fees, if (1) you engage in fraud or material misrepresentation in connection with the plan; (2) you do not meet the repayment terms of this plan, or (3) your action or inaction adversely affects the collateral or our rights in the collateral.

We can refuse to make additional extensions of credit or reduce your credit limit if (1) any reasons mentioned above exist; (2) the value of the dwelling securing the line declines significantly below its appraised value for purposes of the line; (3) we reasonably believe that you will not be able to meet the repayment requirements due to a material change in your financial circumstances; (4) you are in default of a material obligation of the agreement; (5) government action prevents us from imposing the annual percentage rate provided for in the agreement; (6) the priority of our security interest is adversely affected by government action to the extent that the value of the security interest is less than 120 percent of the credit line; (7) a regulatory agency has notified us that continued advances would constitute an unsafe and unsound business practice, or (8) the maximum annual percentage rate is reached.

MINIMUM PAYMENT REQUIREMENTS: You can obtain credit advances for either 5 years or 8 years depending on the plan you have. This period is called the "draw period." At our option, we may renew or extend the draw period. After the draw period ends the repayment period will begin. The repayment period will not be longer than 5 years for the plan having a 5 year draw period or longer than 7 years for the plan having an 8 year draw period. You will be required to make monthly payments during both the draw and repayment periods. At the time you obtain a credit advance a payoff period of 120 monthly payments will be used to calculate your payment if your draw period is 5 years and a payoff period of 180 monthly payments will be used if your draw
period is 8 years. The payoff period will always be the shorter of the payoff period for your outstanding balance or the time remaining to the maturity date. Your payment will be set to repay the balance after the advance, at the current annual percentage rate, within the payoff period. Your payment will remain the same unless you obtain another credit advance. Your payment may also change if the annual percentage rate increases or decreases. Each time the annual percentage rate changes, we will adjust your payment to repay the balance within the original payoff period. Your payment will include any amounts past due and any amount by which you have exceeded your credit limit, and all other charges. Your payment will never be less than the smaller of $\$ 25.00$, or the full amount that you owe.

MINIMUM PAYMENT EXAMPLE - FIVE YEAR DRAW PERIOD PLAN: If you made only the minimum monthly payment and took no other credit advances it would take 10 years to pay off a credit advance of $\$ 10,000$ at an ANNUAL PERCENTAGE RATE of $3.75 \%$. During that period, you would make 119 payments of $\$ 100.07$ and one (1) final payment of $\$ 99.95$.

MINIMUM PAYMENT EXAMPLE - EIGHT YEAR DRAW PERIOD PLAN: If you made only the minimum monthly payment and took no other credit advances it would take 15 years to pay off a credit advance of $\$ 10,000$ at an ANNUAL PERCENTAGE RATE of $3.75 \%$. During that period, you would make 179 payments of $\$ 72.73$ and one (1) final payment of $\$ 72.26$.

FEES AND CHARGES: In order to open, use and maintain a line of credit plan, you must pay the following fees to us:

Origination Fee: $\$ 500.00$ (Due at closing) (Waived with $\$ 10,000$ minimum advance taken at closing) (FINANCE CHARGE)

You must pay certain fees to third parties to open the plan. These fees generally total between $\$ 0.00$ and $\$ 1,350.00$. If you ask, we will provide you with an itemization of the fees you will have to pay third parties.

FEE REIMBURSEMENT: You may have to pay certain bonafide third party fees to open the plan. The Lender may pay some or all of the bona-fide third party fees on your behalf; however, if you pay off and close the plan within 36 months of its opening date, you agree to reimburse the Lender for those bona-fide third party fees, as permitted by applicable law. If you ask, Lender will provide you with an itemization of the bona-fide third party fees you will have to pay third parties.

PROPERTY INSURANCE: You must carry insurance on the property that secures this plan. If the property is located in a Special Flood Hazard Area we will require you to obtain flood insurance if it is available.

REFUNDABILITY OF FEES: If you decide not to enter into this plan within three business days of receiving this disclosure and the home equity brochure, you are entitled to a refund of any fee you may have already paid.

TRANSACTION REQUIREMENTS: All advances must be a minimum amount of $\$ 500.00$.

TAX DEDUCTIBILITY: You should consult a tax advisor regarding the deductibility of interest and charges for the plan.

VARIABLE RATE FEATURE: This plan has a variable rate feature and the annual percentage rate (corresponding to the periodic rate) and the minimum payment may change as a result. The annual percentage rate includes only interest and no other costs. The annual percentage rate is based on the value of an index. The index is the Prime Rate published in the Money Rates column of the Wall Street Journal. When a range of rates has been published the highest rate will be used. We will use the most recent index value available to us as of 30 days before the date of any annual percentage rate adjustment. To determine the annual percentage rate that will apply to your account, we add a margin to the value of the Index. If the rate is not already rounded we then round up to the next $.25 \%$. The margin you receive is based on certain creditworthiness factors and the amount of equity in your property. Your margin may be higher or lower than the one shown in the historical table. Ask us for the current index value, margin for which you qualify and annual percentage rate. After you open a plan, rate information will be provided on periodic statements that we send you.

RATE CHANGES: The annual percentage rate can change semi-annually on the first day of January and July.

The rate cannot increase or decrease more than 2.0 percentage points in any one year period. The maximum ANNUAL PERCENTAGE RATE that can apply is $15.0 \%$ or the maximum permitted by law, whichever is less. However, under no circumstances will your ANNUAL PERCENTAGE RATE go below $3.75 \%$ at any time during the term of the plan.

MAXIMUM RATE AND PAYMENT EXAMPLE: FIVE YEAR DRAW PERIOD PLAN: If you had an outstanding balance of $\$ 10,000$, the minimum payment at the maximum ANNUAL PERCENTAGE RATE of $15.0 \%$ would be $\$ 161.36$. This annual percentage rate could be reached at the time of the $61^{\text {st }}$ payment.

MAXIMUM RATE AND PAYMENT EXAMPLE: EIGHT YEAR DRAW PERIOD PLAN: If you had an outstanding balance of $\$ 10,000$, the minimum payment at the maximum ANNUAL PERCENTAGE RATE of $15.0 \%$ would be $\$ 139.99$. This annual percentage rate could be reached at the time of the $61^{\text {st }}$ payment.

MARGIN: The margin you receive is based on certain creditworthiness factors and the amount of equity in your property. Your margin may be higher or lower than the one shown on the Historical Table. Please ask us about the margin for which you qualify.

HISTORICAL EXAMPLE: The following table shows how the annual percentage rate and the minimum payments for a single $\$ 10,000$ credit advance would have changed based on changes in the index over the past 15 years. The index values are from the last business day of January of each year. While only one payment per year is shown, payments may have varied during each year. The table assumes that no additional credit advances were taken, that only the minimum payments were made, and that the rate remained constant during each year. It does not necessarily indicate how the index or your payments will change in the future.
